Bulldozers prepare site

Work to bulldoze a warehouse and electricity sub-station to build 47 homes on former brewery land in Burton has been completed.

Demolition had been delayed as the owners were struggling to sell the land due to its high density surroundings, it has emerged.

Plans to build the homes in Victoria Crescent had previously been approved and the applicant, Coleman Investments Ltd, was given a year for work on the site to begin, said a council spokesman.

The applicant was later given further approval by the planning authority, East planning authority, East Staffordshire Borough Council, to extend this time limit from one year to 18 months.

The plan includes building four affordable homes and 94

car parking spaces.

The buildings were in a generally good state of repair and were, until recently, utilised by Ritchie's, a beer and wine manufacturing products specialist, and Consortia's, a construction com-

pletion service operator. Ritchie Products later relo cated to Derby Road in Burton. Consortia has consolidated its business in Derby

A nurse who has been at the forefront of promoting prostate cancer screening in Burton has been shortlisted for a prestigious award.
Sarah Minns, a urology

advanced nurse practitioner at Burton's Queen's Hospital, is a finalist in the Nurse of the Year category run by the Nursing Times.

Her nomination is for her work in raising awareness of male cancer.

The urology team, led by consultant surgeon Jyoti Shah, have also been nom-inated in the Cancer Nursing

category.
Burton Hospitals' urology team have been in the vanguard of promoting the fight against prostate cancer, and they linked up with Burton Albion Football Club to host screening sessions for

The winners of the 2017 Nursing Times Awards will be announced on Thursday, November 2.

The screening sessions, aimed at men aged 50 and older, are a new way of getting men to take the potentially

life-saving test for prostate cancer by taking sessions directly to the patients.

It has been backed by Championship side Burton Albion with screening taking place at the Pirelli Stadium, in Princess Way.

So far, more than 350 men have been tested, with 24 needing further treatment.

Now the unit is aiming to encourage African Caribbean men to come forward to have the test as they are at a higher

There is a one in eight chance of men being diagnosed with prostate cancer but in African Caribbean men it is one in four.

A screening talk was held at the Burton Caribbean Association, in Uxbridge Street, last Thursday, to encourage African Caribbean men to take the test.
