House of Commons to hear of football club's role in society

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Burton Albion will be recognised in Parliament for their community outstanding

The club has been named as the Midlands Checkatrade Community Club of the Year as part of the 2017 English Football League (EFL) awards – beating off competition from around the region.

Following the outstanding efforts of Burton Albion Community Trust, the club will be joined alongside five other regional winners at the House of Commons. Burton Albion will then be

put forward alongside the five other regional winners for the overall Checkatrade Community Club Year of the Award.

The trust was commended for introducing prostate checks for fans in conjunction with Prostate Cancer UK and Burton's Queen's Hospital, which ultimately led to 11 of the 130 fans tested being

referred to hospital, diagnosed with prostate cancer

and receiving treatment.

Assault lands man with court costs

A 38-year-old man has been ordered to pay compensation after he admitted assault. Sherne Gordon, of Ash

Street, Burton, appeared at Southern Derbyshire Magistrates' Court recently.

He admitted assaulting a woman in Burton on October 9, having previously denied the offence.

Gordon has been made the subject of a 20-week prison sentence suspended for 18 months because the offence involved a serious assault on the victim with punches, causing injuries and Gordon has a previous record for viol-

He was also made the subject of a 12-week curfew, and ordered to carry out 200 hours unpaid work, and was made the subject of a restraining order not to contact the victim and ordered to pay £200 compensation and £300 court
