A TOP consultant surgeon, community stalwarts, lecturers and the woman who managed a Covid vaccination centre are among the people recognised by King Charles III as the New Year's Honours are announced.

We have listed below every single medal recipient from Staffordshire.

Jyoti Shah, a consultant surgeon at Burton's Queen's Hospital; Catherine May Nash, who managed the vaccination centre at Pirelli Stadium; and Angela Mary Ham, the head of business support services at The National Memorial Arboretum, are among those who will receive the MBE.

Miss Shah will receive the MBE for service to medicine in acknowledgement of her career and work in the screening and diagnosis of thousands of prostate cancer patients in the community. She has worked in the NHS for 26 years and established a "one-stop" clinic for patients with suspected prostate cancer, with a rapid turnaround time of three days for benign results and seven days for confirmed cancer diagnosis to enable prompt access to treatment for patients. This was acknowledged as 'excellent' by Cancer Research UK.

In 2016, she launched the "Inspire Health" community campaign "Fighting Prostate Cancer", giving up her own time to offer men free prostate screening in their local communities outside of a hospital setting, Life-saving surgeon Jyoti is recognised in King Charles first honours

such as at football stadiums, community centres and places of religious worship. To date, the programme has screened more than 2,800 men and diagnosing 90 cases of prostate cancer.

Miss Shah said: "I am overwhelmed to be receiving an MBE, it is incredibly exciting, and I feel so proud. But so many people have helped in this journey, and I would like to thank all of them.

Among those recognised in the New Year's honours are Professor Janet Lord, of Barton under Needwood, who is made a Commander of the Order of the British Empire (CBE), for her contribution to research aimed at understanding why ageing people lose muscle, bone and cartilage.

Those who have been long-standing servants to their local communities who have been recognised are Arthur Renshaw, who has been awarded the BEM for his service of more than 40 years on Draycott in the Clay Parish Council and being a volunteer at St Augustine's First School.

Described as a "community champion", Gordon Dale was made a Medallist of the Order of the British Empire (BEM) for his many years of service in Edingale for the parish council, Holy Trinity church, village hall and the Garden Guild. Mike Allen has been chairman of Haughton Parish Council for more than 20 years and was made a Member of the Order of the British Empire (MBE). He has also served on the executive committee of the Staffordshire Parish Council Association since 2004, as well as being a trustee of Community Link Staffordshire since 2008.

Alan White, leader of Staffordshire County Council, said: "While publication of His Majesty's first Honours List may bring a sense of the 'new,' I feel a great sense of continuity when I read about the work, commitment and achievements of those recognised. Staffordshire's communities are built upon the efforts and spirit of their residents and I am always humbled by the contribution that people make, whether it is displaying the highest levels of professional expertise, or by volunteering to help

## Lionesses lead the pride in New Year honour's list

FOOTBALL'S Lionesses command the pride of their country in a New Year Honours list which also sees Queen guitarist Brian May and artist Grayson Perry knighted.

Captain Leah Williamson is among four of England's Euro 2022-winning side to be named in the list, being made an OBE while her teammates Lucy

Bronze, Beth Mead and Ellen White are all made MBEs.

The team's Dutch head coach Sarina Wiegman also joins the party, after the Foreign Office made her an honorary

Musician and animal welfare campaigner Sir Brian, who famously played God Save The Queen on the roof of Buckingham Palace during the Golden Jubilee before performing again at the Platinum Jubilee two decades later, has been

appointed a knight bachelor for services to music and charity.

The astrophysicist told the PA news agency: "I regard it as a kind of charge, like a kind of commission to do the things that one would expect a knight to do - to fight for justice, to fight for people who don't have

any voice." Sir Grayson, the 62-year-old artist, writer and broadcaster who is known for his tapestries, ceramic works and cross-dressing, is knighted for services to

the arts while fashion designer Dame Mary Quant is made a Companion of Honour. Elsewhere in sport, Olympic

heptathlon gold medallist Denise Lewis, now the president of Commonwealth Games England, is made a dame, while in showbiz, actor Stephen Graham is made an OBE and comedian Frank Skinner an MBE.
